## RGGI CAN PROMOTE ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE IN PENNSYLVANIA

## Communities of color and low-income communities across Pennsylvania have faced historical and disproportionate harms from environmental pollution.

- Research shows that people in poverty and non-Whites all have higher risk of exposure to air pollution than the White population.
- Communities living near polluting industries most often communities of color - endure more air pollution, higher asthma rates, and more environmental health harms than white communities.

## Steps to control pollution and turn back climate change, like the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative ("RGGI"), can and must protect and benefit these communities.



- RGGI, a program that caps carbon pollution from power plants and creates a system for power plants to pay for the pollution they emit, can do that.
  - RGGI will **cut carbon pollution by 25%**, have a significant impact on climate change, and **create 30,000 PA jobs**.

## Under RGGI, Pennsylvania can take steps to help vulnerable communities.

- The Wolf Administration has committed to monitor RGGI's effects to make sure it does not shift pollution to communities of color and lowincome communities already heavily impacted by pollution.
- A significant portion of the proceeds from RGGI should be used to assist low-income families with their energy bills and to invest in development, job creation, and clean energy investment in communities that historically and currently face disproportionate environmental harm.
- The Wolf Administration has proposed an Environmental Justice Communities Trust Fund (EJCTF) to make targeted investments to minimize and correct adverse environmental impacts, create jobs, and empower frontline communities.
